CHILDREN'S ACCESSIBLE TRANSPORTATION (CAT)

CAT is an Easy Lift program that provides rides to child-serving nonprofits that are unable to afford their own transportation. Last year, CAT provided over 8,000 rides via 20 organizations such as the Boys & Girls Club of Santa Barbara, CALM, Montecito YMCA, Storyteller Children's Center, and Transition House. Girls Inc. of Carpinteria utilized CAT again this year to shuttle 25 girls from Carpinteria to UCSB daily for four weeks to participate in Eureka, a program that encourages girls to explore STEM career paths. In addition, when Girls Inc. of Santa Barbara were short on vehicles at the last minute, we loaned them a vehicle at no charge.

HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR & EASY LIFT PASSENGER

When Judith Meisel was 12 years old, the Nazis forced her family from their home in Lithuania to a segregated ghetto where she was compelled to work as a slave laborer. Three years later, her family was taken to the Stutthof Concentration Camp, where she suffered greatly, losing her mother to the gas chamber. Judith and her sister escaped during a frigid death march, crossing a frozen river on their hands and knees. After more horrifying experiences, Judith was finally liberated in May 1945. Now 84, Judith is a local Santa Barbara hero who spends much of her time educating young people about the horrors of the Holocaust. Five years ago when Judith could no longer drive, she started to rely on Easy Lift's Dial-a-Ride service, for which she is extremely grateful.



"Easy Lift is just wonderful," said Judith. "I tell everyone what a great service they provide. For me, they are my lifeline to the community. Without them it would be extremely difficult and very expensive to get to my medical appointments or the grocery store."

DIAL-A-RIDE

Dial-A-Ride is Easy Lift's most commonly known service. This year we scheduled **76,244 rides for 1,971 people with limited mobility**. Our Dial-A-Ride program is subsidized through donations, grants, and special public transit monies. The service is available for people who are physically or cognitively unable to ride the Metropolitan Transit District (MTD). Passengers are able to travel throughout south Santa Barbara County from Goleta to Carpinteria. Registered passengers pay only \$3.50 for each one-way ride.

GREATEST GENERATION ACCESSIBLE TRANSPORTATION (GGAT)

GGAT provides grouped rides for seniors who may not necessarily qualify for Dial-A-Ride, but have limited means to reach programs and services for the elderly community. GGAT works closely with senior serving agencies such as the Goleta Community Center, Community Action Commission, San Rafael Church, Villa Caridad, San Vicente Mobile Homes, and St. Vincent's.
